



The use of the word "amend" tells us that Debbie had to change her opinion; thus, the actions at the beginning of the sentence ("neighborly acts") really caused the change. The end of the sentence needs to convey Debbie's opinion prior to witnessing "several neighborly acts." Adversarial is the only word among the five choices that describes un-neighborly acts.


